■授業の目的と概要(Course purpose/outline)
This class will overview the trends/policies in the US economy from the early 1900s up to the Donald Trump presidency. We will briefly cover three broad stages of US economic history as proposed by Valli (2018): ① The Western frontier and its economic/demographic consequences; ② The Fordist model of growth; and ③ The building of an economic empire via financial globalization, military/political power, and technological advancements. NOTE: This class will mainly be in English.

授業の方法(Class method)	The main part of each lesson will be an oral explanation of the contents listed below. At the start of each lesson, you will be given an information sheet with blanks that you will need to complete while listening to the lecture. At the end of each lesson, you will answer a short quiz about the vocabulary and main ideas of the day's topic. Submitting the quiz will count as your attendance.
	In addition, each lesson's information sheet will also have 2-3 short answer questions that will require you to make a personal response about the content. You will answer 1 of these (chosen at random by the lecturer) at the start of the next lesson. This means you have one week to reflect and prepare your written response.
	In general, each lesson will proceed as follows:
	~20 minutes — Answer 1 personal response question from the previous lesson ~60 minutes — Lecture ~10 minutes — A short quiz about the day's topic
